



Turing Centenary Research Fellowship and Scholar Competition: Submission Instructions

Deadline for Submission - Dec. 16, 2011

1. Login to the EasyChair submission page at:

<http://www.easychair.org/conferences/?conf=turingresearch2012>

2. Click on 'New Submission'

3. Fill in your 'Address for Correspondence' details and your basic proposer details at 'Author 1' (only one proposer permitted)

**4. Enter your proposal title, and a summary of your proposal (500 to 1000 words) in the 'Title, Abstract and Other Information' box.
Click on the 'TURING SCHOLAR' or 'TURING FELLOW' category.**

5. Upload your proposal as a PDF 'Paper' by clicking on 'Choose File', etc. Your proposal file should contain:

Project Description	A detailed description of the proposed research - not more than 10 single-spaced 12-point-font pages
Justification of resources	Describe and justify how you would spend the award - less than half a page (cost in UK pounds)
A timeline for the 3 years	Describe what you hope to deliver, and the timing - about half a page or less
Training/ mentoring details (for prospective Turing Scholars only)	Describe what plans you have for training during the 3 years, and name(s) of anyone who has agreed to mentor or supervise you over the period - one page or less

6. Upload your 'Attachment' as a zipped folder containing:

CV	Include training, publications, professional talks, awards, etc. relevant to the research project - not more than 4 pages
3 letters of recommendation	These should provide an opinion on your suitability for the proposed research, and should be signed, and scanned
For prospective Turing Research Scholars only: A ten-page Dissertation	Discuss one of the 'big questions', showing novelty of thinking, and engagement with the background to the question considered - use 12-point and standard margins and spacing

7. When you have finished, click on the 'Submit' button.
